BUSY HERE AND THERE

There is an event recorded in I Kings 20 which was designed to make king Ahab aware that God knew of the king's failure to obey. God also used this incident to pronounce judgment on the king. Ahab, along with Jezebel were two of the most wicked rulers Israel ever had. But Ahab was still king, and God had entrusted him to execute God's judgment on Syria. His instruction was to utterly destroy, but instead Ahab made a treaty with Benhadad and let him go free.

Later the king is approached by a prophet disguised as a soldier The prophet gives this story, "Your servant went out into the midst of the battle, and behold, a man turned aside and brought a man unto me and said, 'keep this man: if by any means he be missing, then shall your life be for his life, or else you shall pay a talent of silver: and as your servant was busy here and there, he was gone.' Ahab listened and delivered his verdict, 'So shall your judgment be; you have decided it.'" Then the prophet reveals himself to Ahab and tells him, like Nathan told David, "You are the man," Guilty by your own mouth, sentenced by your own sense of justice, "Thus says the Lord, because you have let go out of your 'vand a man whom I appointed to utter destruction, therefore your life shall go for his life." The prophet set before the king a picture of his neglect of opportunity, and it is worthy of our study. "Busy here ane there" has robbed many good people of great blessings. It has blinded their eyes to the responsibilities they have to Jesus and their fellowman.

- 1. While I was busy here and there I failed to teach my neighbor. "And the things you have heard of me among many witnessed, the same commit to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also" (2 Tim. 2:2). Our sense of love for our fellow man and our duty to God imposes this responsibility on us. Paul referred to himself as a "debtor" in his mission of teaching the gospel. The concept of salvation is important, and we realize that it is, but living gets in the way. Dying gets in the way. Eating, sports and a thousand other activities interfere. What shall our judgment be?
- 2. While I was busy here and there, I failed to teach my children. Now, busy can be good, and just because we aren't busy doesn't mean we take time to deal with our children in the way God desires. We need to realize how serious this obligation is. Read Deut. 6:4-9. There is one God. Love Him with your heart, soul and mind. Teach this to your children when you sit with them (car, dinner table, etc), walk with them, when you go to bed and when you get up. Have you ever thought about painting scripture verses on the walls and door jambs in your house? "A child left to himself causes shame to his mother" (Prov. 29:15). "And you fathers provoke not your children to wrath: but nurture them in the chastening and admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4). If you're too busy to raise them, you're too busy to have them.
- 3. While I was busy here and there, I lost my own soul. Most don't mean to get too busy. They're just trying to make a living. Waiting for the children to get a little older, waiting for warmer weather to attend services. It's always something. It's easy to lose your soul. Just get too busy to save it. Busy here and there. It's time to get busy about the Lord's work. Time won't wait.
