PILGRIMS

"Dearly bleoved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims..." (I Peter 2:11). Peter goes on to tell his audience some aspects of a pilgrims life, but the point is that we are temporary on this earth. We encourage each other with songs about heaven and our desire to go "home" to be with God and His eternal family, and that's the "hope" Peter talks about in chapter 1. But a "pilgrim" faces difficulties in life that makes the journey dangerous. Look at a few.

- 1. We're only here for a short time. Life is temporary, and that's difficult to face. Life is, for the most part, enjoyable. We fill it with friends and family and activities. Boredom is an enemy. With the affluence of American life come all the "toys" to help us fill our days and weeks: time shares, boats, atheltic equipment. From mountains to sea shore, and even foreign countries, we seek excitment. We admire the beauty of God's earth, and long to explore. There's more than we can see in a normal lifetime. No problem with any of these, unless they distract us too much from the basic point: we won't last forever. We're temporary, dwelling in a strange place not our home. When we begin to feel permanent in an earthly location, we've lost a focus that is necessary. We're not trying to be morbid, just realistic.
- 2, Earth, life centered. We educate ourself and our children for a career, and that's a good thing. The writer of Ecclesiastes tells us that work is a gift from God. It provides for our families and helps us fill our time. We're told, "Whatsoever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might." Great advice, and we should take it to heart for self and teach it to our children. Again, it may be the exclusion of a spiritual focus that destroys us. "Seek first the kingdom of God..." (Matt. 6:33). Solomon covers this well in Eccl. 12. Again, distractions work against us. School, Job, eventual retirement become our focus. Eternal life should be ever before our eyes.
- 3.Going Home. Ever thought about building your "dream" home? Jesus built ours John 14:1ff. Do you look forward to it? We want "roots", a place to belong. We look forward to high school and college reunions where we can visit with friends from years gone by. Here we may find a life for 70 or 80 years. There it is permanent in a way we can never find here. Do you ever dream about meeting God's whole family? Seeing the faither of your spirit, and giving thanks for all He's done face to face. That home is for those who seek it and prepare for it. Jesus is the way. Let Him guide you.

SPIRITUAL WORSHIP

We're all familiar with the Lord's caution in John 4 to worship "in spirit and truth". I wonder how many times in ages gone by mankind has left God out of worship by altering His word to suit the whims of the day. Jesus commented on this in Matt. 15 with the conclusion that such worship is "vain". But we also fail the God of heaven when we leave our heart out of the worship. "In spirit" seems to apply to our participation on an emotional level. I came across this story some time ago: "A man once dreamed that he was in a fine, large church building where many people had gathered. He saw people singing, but heard no sound. He saw the minister moving his lips but heard no words. After a time the congregation rose to pray. He heard only the voice of a child praying.

He was puzzled and amazed. An angel came and stood by him to explain: 'You've heard today as God hears,' he said.

The singers were thinking about other things as they sang, and were not actually praising God. The minister was watching his words that he might preach a good sounding sermon. God did not hear him. Only the child had feelings of love and reverence in her heart for the Lord, and only her words of praise and prayer reached the Heavenly Father."

Perhaps the story exaggerates the point. Perhaps not. But I wonder if the Lord is hearing us individually today. Do your part. That's what each of us is responsible for. JLS
