#### SURVIVING THE NIGHTMARE

"I have had dreams and I have had nightmares. I overcame the nightmares because of my dreams. (Jonas Salk, MD)

Dr. Salk is in some very fine company. The dream of the "city of God" enabled Abraham to endure the nightmare of leaving home. The dream of departing and being "with Christ" enabled Paul to endure the nightmare of privation and persecution. And the dream of the "joy that was set before Him" enabled Jesus to endure the nightmare of the cross. And so it is yet today: The dream of tomorrow allows us to overcome the occasional and inevitable nightmare today.

For example many are the congregations who have risen above the nightmare of dissention and division. Congregations who have grown weary of "biting and devouring one another." Congregations who have allowed Christ's dream of eace and productivity to become their dream of peace and productivity. Congregations who work, and work hard, to make the dream a reality; who have learned to "endeavor to keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peaceful, harmonious relationsips. May their tribe increase!

And many are the gospel preachers who have overcome the nightmare of unwrranted ill treatment. Preachers who have fallen victim to the words and actions of fellow preachers who are quick to "pigeon-hole" and ostracize those who do not line up in their camp and become one of their "friends." Preachers who have had to endure the coldness and hurt of being turned away by their brethren when their brethren were most needed - when sick, when struggling, when needing a helping hand. I have never been victim of either, but have wept with those of my acquaintance who have. The impressive thing is that the dreams keep these godly men going. The dream of pleasing God, not men. The dream of contributing to the kingdom. The dream of strengthening their brethren and teaching the lost. The dream of Heaven.

And many are the Christians who have survived and risen above the nightmare of some besetting temptation. Christians who have come to grips with their spiritual "Achilles heel" - perhaps some lust, some passion, some hatred, or some habit. Christians who have determined to allow the dream of a godly life and a sterling influence to become the consuming passion of their lives. Christians who dream of being of greater service to their Lord and to their brethren. Christians who dream of someday "going home."

The examples could be multiplied, with ease, many times over. But the lesson is simple: a valid dream, coupled with meaningful action, will do much to offset the nightmare - any nightmare - your nightmare.
