#### THE CHRISTIAN AND SOCIAL MEDIA

"Whoever restrains his words has knowledge, and he who has a cool spirit is a man of understanding" (Prov. 17:27).

Like it or not, social media is here to stay. While we shouldn't overreact to the dangers of this new media, we must not ignore them either. There needs to be more discussion about social media. I found online some good rules that I wanted to share:

Be careful before you hit send (James 1 19-20; Prov. 10:19; 15:2; 21:23). Could your message be taken the wrong way? Does this need to be kept private? Vill it needlessly offend someone?

Don't vent anger (James 1:19-20; Eph. 4:26-27; Prov. 14:29; 29:11). Don't air family problems or church issues online. If you're angry at someone, go speak to them personally. The rest of us don't need to know.

Neverlie (Eph. 4:25; Col. 3:9-10; Rev. 21:8). And embellishment is the same as lying.

Don't glorify self (Matt. 6:5, 7, 16; Prov. 25:27; 26:12). Hide the good you do. Advertise what is done for you, Give glory to God instead.

Watch out for ungodly influences (I Cor. 15:33; 2 Tim. 2:16-18; 2 Pet. 2:18-20). Beware of worldly ideas, false teaching, filthy language, dirty jokes and gossip.

Don't let this become an addiction (I Cox. 6:12). It can easily take over your life if you're not careful.

Protect your marrigae (Prov. 7:5-27). The American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers says 81% of its members have used or faced evidence plucked from social networking sites in the past five years.

Use social networking to God's glory (Mark 16:15; Eph. 4:29; Col. 4:6; Matt. 5:14-16). There are so many positive ways we can use this new media. Let's use it to advance God's Cause, not the Devil's.

Father, protect us from the evils of social media. May you be glorified in every email, tweet and Facebook comment we post this day.

#### **An Angry Countenance**

We say so much about gossiping and deal so severely with gossippers, yet we seldom strike a blow against those who lend the ear to malicious words. But the gossipper could hardly persist in his misdeed without someone to give a hearing to him. And God is not silent about this matter. Condider the following two points: "The north wind drives away rain: so does an angry countenance a backbiting tongue" (Prov. 25:23). The point is simple: by a foreboding look, still the gossiping tongue. The backbiter must be made to see that we are no audience for his tales. The angry countenance serves two purposes. First, it spares us from hearing the complete bit of gossip, and second, it conveys our disapproval to the one who bears it. In all this we are provided an excellent opportunity to teach the offender God's will abouttalebearing.

Try as we may, we will probably not be able to escape all gossip, so our next responsibility regarding it is: don't repeat any that you might hear. Psalms 15 speaks of the happy future of him who does not "take up a reproach against his neighbor." One must not pass gossip down the table of conversation, for in so doing the hearer becomes a gossipper. Happy is he who not only refrains from gossip, but from listening.
