COMPLETE RELIGION

"And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul and with all thy might" (Deut. 6:5) What is religion? To that question the world today returns three answers: 1) Religion consists in thinking. This is the answer of the psychologist. 2) Religion consists in feeling. This is the answer of the emotionallist. 3) Religion consists in acting. This is the answer of the sociologist. The mistake here is that each one considers his own answer complete in itself, whereas the Bible teaches all three. Look at a couple of passages.

"By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet (thinking), moved with fear (feeling), prepared an ark (acting)" (Heb. 11:7). "If any man thinketh himself to be religious (thinking), while he bridleth not his tongue (acting), but deceiveth his own heart (feeling), this man's religion is vain" (Jas. 1:26). When a man is religious in the New Testament sense, he passes through an experience which is made up of thinking, feeling and acting, and thus gives himself wholly to 'he service of Christ.

Thinking in Religion - There are some whose religion consists solely in their thoughts. "Here is what I think," you hear from many in matters of religion. This is the standard by which they attempt to prove all things to their satisfaction. You may read the Bible to them and say, "Now this is what the Bible says," but their answer will usually be, "I know, but I think..." Thus they make their own intellect their Bible, and pay very little or no attention to what God's Word teaches.

A man is often mistaken in what he thinks is right or wrong. When the nation of Israel first came into the Promised Land and was ruled by judges, often following the death of a judge the nation would forsake God and turn to the idols of their neighbors. Hence, "in those days there was no king in Israel, but every man did that which was right in his own eyes" (Jud. 17:6). This brought about the downfall of Israel. "There is a way which seems right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death" (Prov. 14:12). God is concerned with our thoughts, and tries to instruct us so our motivation is accurate. (Phil. 4:8).

Feeling in Religion - Just as there are some to whom religion is all thinking, so there are others to whom it is all feeling. They think their salvation is based entirely on feeling. They are heard to say, "I know that I'm saved because I feel good." We ought to say, "I feel good because I know I'm saved." Such a feeling is based on having done the will of God. John said, "And hereby we know that we know Him, if we keep his commandments" (I John 2:3).

Solomon said, "He that trusts in his own heart is a fool" (Prov. 28:26). A man may be ever so sincere and yet be ever so sincerely wrong. When Joseph's brothers told their father, Jacob, that Joseph was dead, Jacob said, "I will go down into the grave mourning for my son" (Gen. 37:35). His grief was real, but the truth was, Joseph wasn't dead. Mere feelings can be deceiving.

"He that believeth" (Mk. 16:16) {Thinking} - "Except you repent" (Luke 13:3) {Feeling} - "And is baptized" (Mk. 16:16) {Acting}. This obedience is not final and complete.
