BUT WHAT IF ...?

Hypothetical situations are sometimes employed by those who wish to justify their failure to obey the simple and understandable commands of God. However, an examination of the Bible reveals that those who were people of faith, were saved as their faith moved them to obey the precepts of God.

"By faith Noah, being warned by God about things not yet seen, in reverence prepared an ark for the salvation of his household." "By faith Abraham, when he was called, obeyed by going out to a place which he was to receive for an inheritance." By faith he (Moses) kept the Passover and the sprinkling of the blood, so that he who destroyed the firstborn might not touch them." "By faith the walls of Jericho fell down after they had been encircled for seven days" (Heb. 11:7, 8, 28, 30).

In the day of Pentecost those who gladly received Peter's words "were baptized" because they were instructed to kepent and let each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins" (Acts 2:41, 38). In Acts eight an Ethiopian eunuch was brought to believe in the Christ and immediately desired to be baptized (v. 35-39). When Saul of Tarsus was convinced that the Jesus whom he persecuted was truly the Christ, he arose and was baptized and washed away his sins calling on the name of the Lord (Acts 9:18; 22:16). When we recall Jesus' words concerning who shall be saved, "he that believes and is baptized shall be saved" (Mk 16:16), we are not surprised that those who learned of Christ obeyed his commands in order to receive God's saving grace.


Noah demonstrated his faith in God by preparing the ark, but what if Noah had determined that he would be delivered without obeying God? Would he have been saved from the flood? Abraham became the faither of a great nation because he obeyed God in leaving his homeland, but what if he had stayed at home and trusted (?) God without obeying God's command to leave? Those who put the blood on their doorposts were spared the loss of the firstborn, but what if they had failed to put the blood on their doorposts? After marching around the city for seven days, the wall of Jericho fell, but what if the children of Israel had refused to march around the city? Remember, it was faith that moved all these to obey God's commands.

The first gospel sermon (Acts 2) caused many to repent and be baptized for the remission of their sins, but what if some of these had decided not to obey God's command, believing that faith without baptism would save them? What if Saul had decided not to obey the command to arise and be baptized in order that his sins might be washed away?

The point is, "Not every one who says to me, Lord, Lord, will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of faither who is in heaven" (Matt. 7:21).
