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CAN WE IMPROVE?

Thus my churchgoing was a merely symbolical and provisional pretice. If it in fact helped to move me in the Christian direction, I was and am unaware of this. (Surprised By Joy, C.S. Lewis)

These sentences appear toward the end of this autobiography of Lewis. The book is the story of Lewis' early life and explains his conversion from atheism to faith. In parts the story has all the excitement of a mystery novel as Lewis traces step by step the influences which led him out of atheism. It is interesting to observe that Lewis' "churchgoing" is said to have had no noticeable effect in moving him toward Christianity.

Now I do not want to lift these statements out of context. To be sure, Lewis is discussing the Episcopal forms which he encountered. But should not his statements make us all call for an examination of the life and character of the churches where we are, even among congregations of Christ, with a view to determining whether we can see a fit soil for faith to thrive in? What about our worship meetings? What about the Bible classes? What about our advocacy of the word from the pulpit? What about activity apart from public meetings?

"Belief comes of hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ." But should there not be something about the Christian community that would draw one to the Lord? Listen to Jesus: "By this shall all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love one to another" (John 13:35). "Neither for these only do I pray, but for them also that believe on me through their word: that they may all be one; even as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us: that the world may believe that you did send me" (John 17:20). Jesus prays for those who believe through the apostolic word... that they may be one... that the world may believe. Belief comes through the apostolic word. But should not the observable effect of that word in the Christian community make an impression also? Should it not add strength to the apostolic testimony?

It is time for honest examination. Do the things seen in modern churches point one to the Lord? Do they tend to aid and mature faith? Or are they often a difficult trial for faith to endure? Is there need for change? If so, where shall we begin? Surely not with me. Nor with you of course. Where then?
