

Prayer does not consist in beautiful expressions, devoutly uttered. Neither does prayer consist of solemn looks, pious tones, or a humble posture of the body. It is possible for one to draw near to God with his mouth and honor Him with his lips and yet his heart is far from him (Matthew 15:8).

of certain essential elements. The following are some of the essential elements of acceptable prayer as found in the Bible:

- 1. Reverence People sometimes approach God as if they thought they were His equal. Jesus taught His disciples to hallow the Father's name (Matthew 6:9).
- 2. In The Name Of Christ We should always approach the Father in prayer through Christ (John 14:13-14). He is our Mediator and High Priest (Hebrews 8:1).
- 3. Sincerely Sometimes there is a temptation to pray to the people rather than to God. Jesus warns us against praying to be seen of men (Matthew 6:5). While praying to God is not the time to deliver a sermon or exhort those who are present.

- 4. Spirit Of Obedience We should desire for God's will to be done in our own life (Matthew 6:10). And when we keep His commandments, He will hear us (I John 3:22).
- 5. Faith And Confidence We should pray believing that God will hear our prayers (James 1:6-8).
- Submission We must realize Acceptable prayer is the blending that God knows what is best for us and we should ask for those things according to His will (John 5:14).
 - 7. A Forgiving Spirit We must be willing to forgive others if we expect the Father to forgive our sins (Matthew 6: 12-15).
 - 8. Humility We can all learn a lesson from the publican, who prayed with downcast eyes (Luke 18:9-14).
 - 9. Unselfishness It is not wrong to pray for what we need, but it is wrong to pray for things to gratify our lusts and selfish ambitions (James 4:2-3).

May we all pray our prayers in an acceptable manner unto God with the spirit and understanding (1 Corinthians 14: 15).
