

"Mental Road Blocks"

I was reading an article about "Tithing", and while I disagree about it being an ordinance in New Testament times, the author did can afford to tithe until they do." It reminds me of a sentiment I often hear about children; "We're waiting to have kids until we can afford them.". A noble idea, but sort of naive. No one can "afford" children. We have them because we love them. They're one of our greatest earthly blessings.

The same principle is true of almost any service to God. We can't render any particular service until we just do it. Remove the mental road blocks and do it. I remember the first sermon L preached. It didn't go over nearly as well as I had planned. I promised myself it would be my last. That decision relieved so much stress and pressure, the realization that I would never have to go thru "that" again. But the church was desperate and I was "encouraged" to do it again. Still going thru the experience some 50 years later, still trying.

The same was true of personal evangelism. Speaking to a crowd was difficult, but in some ways easier than talking to one person, especially meeting a stranger and introducing him to the Lord. "What if argument results?" I don't like confrontations. There are hundreds of "reasons" to refrain from sharing the truth. Just do it.

It doesn't always get easier. Disagreements do sometimes result, but so do baptisms. Most of life is a risk. Progress doesn't usually come make an interesting point. "Nobody easily, and the Lord deserves our best efforts. These efforts usually improve with experience if we don't let Satan talk us out of trying.

> It's amazing what we can do when we just launch forth. The early church dispersed from Jerusalem because of persecution, but "those who had been scattered went about preaching the word" (Acts 8:4). They didn't complain about their "bad luck" or their limitations. Some of these folks landed in Antioch and talked to their neighbors there and a church resulted (11:19ff). The teachers weren't apostles, just ordinary Christians doing their best.

> The intent of these few words isn't to get you to do evangelism. Check your mental road blocks and try something. Anything. Especially if you think you can't. Sometimes we really can't. I'm not much of a song leader. No "ear for music", or voice either for that matter. But, I didn't know, really know, until I tried. "You can't afford to tithe till you just do it." "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in My house. Test me in this, says the LORD Almighty, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it" (Malachi 3:10). It will be exciting to see how God blesses us.
