

"Little Deeds"

She has done what she could: she has anointed Mv body beforehand for the burial. Truly I say to you, wherever the gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be spoken of in memory of her. (Mark 14:8-9)

We may be lead to think at times that only "great deeds" will be remembered. We may be lead to think that the defining moments of our lives consist only of our most celebrated, well-known achievements. We look up to the heroes of film and fiction because they are often portrayed as larger than life, and we may begin to think that have shown toward His we won't be remembered unless we accomplish enormous feats. The glaring Truth in this passage, however, is that the "little deeds"--those everyday inconveniences and sacrifices--are what define us.

The woman in or text was ridiculed and questioned by men for what she did, but GOD KNEW that it was right; and she was recognized for it. It's safe to say this woman never lead a great army, never became president, and was never featured on the nightly news for saving someone's life, BUT God remembered her for having "done what she could". This small act of anointing became a defining moment for her. Each of us is leaving our mark on the world whether we know it or not. Our eternal destinies are not shaped by grand, heroic accomplishments that are few and far between, rather they are shaped from day to day and from moment to moment as we go about our everyday business. Let's make each moment count! God is watching and "is not unjust so as to forget your work and the love which you name" (Heb. 6:10). Do we seize opportunities we have each and every day to do something good regardless of fanfare?
