# **Check the Tongue**

Speech is a grand endowment of God to men. The power to express thought, the ability to communicate ideas, is one of the true proofs of man's superiority over beasts. A child's first words are dear to a parent. The last words uttered by a loved one in death are treasured.

Experience, history, and the scriptures all attest to the power of the human tongue for good or evil. Experience has deprived us of much if we have not heard the gentle persuasion of a mother's tongue or the stern yet loving rebuke of a father's lips. History, dutifully and faithfully recording the lives of those who made it, weaves a fascinating fabric of events which resulted from words uttered by good and evil men. The Bible tells its readers plainly, "Even so the tongue is a little member, and boasteth great things" (James 3:5)

Often as a doctor seeks to diagnose a disease he says, "Let me look at your tongue." Not only is the tongue an index to the physical state of man, but also it reflects the condition of the "Inner Man." "A good man out of the good treasure of

his heart bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil; for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh." (Luke 6:45) You cannot speak dirty and ungodly language and have a pure heart. A man who "cusses" has something wrong with his heart. Profanity is incompatible with Christianity; you might as well try to mix oil and water.

Profanity is a habit that affects the whole of a man's character. Chemists tell us that a single grain of iodine will impart its color to seven thousand times its weight of water. It is so in higher things; one weakness, one bad habit, may influence one's whole life and character.

Hear the words of the Lord Jesus Christ: "But I say unto you, that every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give an account thereof in the day of judgement. For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned." (Matt 12:36-37)
