Salty Disciples

"Salt is good, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is of no use either for the soil or for the manure pile. It is thrown away. He who has ears to ears to hear, let him hear." (Luke 14:34-35)

In this familiar analogy, Jesus compares Christians to salt, and points out that salt is supposed to be useful, and if it's not useful, it is thrown out! But notice how He says salt is used: 1) For the soil and 2) For the manure pile. In agriculture, a certain amount of salt mixed in soil can provide needed nutrients for crops to grow. What about manure? In fact, in ancient times, salt was mixed together with animal droppings as a catalyst to change the manure into a charcoal-like substance for burning, or to make it more suitable to use as fertilizer.

So what's the point? Jesus is saying that as salt we need to mix with the soil and even manure of the world in order to affect a change. In fact, the very next verse in Luke shows Jesus himself doing that: "Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him." (Luke 15:1) Jesus was mixing with filthy people in order to help them change and grow, and He's telling us to do the same!

But notice what Jesus said about the salt: It has to have flavor to be good for soil or manure. What flavor disciples should we be? He tells us in the verse before: "So therefore, anyone of you that does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:33) We must be "all in" to serving God, with no reservations. If we are "all in" disciples, people around us will notice and we will make a difference in the world. If we are reluctant, half-hearted Christians, we will not stand out and no one will be convicted to change. We will be good for nothing and will be thrown out by God. Different people make a difference!
